Use a range of stones, pebbles, shells or leaved to create transitional artwork in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. Use leaves and sticks to make a face or animal shape.	Focus on multiplication finding the totals of groups of 2, 5 and 10 objects. Pasta/ lego bricks are good for this. Can you make 2,3,4, or 5 equal groups of 2s,5s or 10s. How many are there altogether?	Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Can you share a video of your counting on Tapestry. Research and find out Florence Nightingale. What made her special? Why do we remember her?	Practise reading one of your favourite stories. Film yourself reading it and add to Tapestry. Remember to use expression and hold the pictures up so that we can see them!
Draw what you want to be when you grow up. Why would you like that job? Write about what skills you will need?	Learn and retell the story of 'A Superhero like you.' by Dr Ranj .
