







Year 1 Homework- Autumn Term 1

Please try to complete one of the activities each week in addition to numbots and daily reading practise. You can share your homework on Tapestry as a video or photograph or write/stick it into your homework book- whatever is best suited to the task!

<p>Keep a diary of the weather each day for a week. What was the most frequent weather? What was the least frequent weather?</p> 	<p>Learn to spell the following words:</p> <p>the you like when was they</p> <p>Please note, we will not be testing the children's spellings, but will be delighted to spot them correctly spelt in their writing!</p>	 <p>Practise your ball skills.</p> <p>Can you dribble a football in and out of spaces or kick it carefully to someone else? Can you throw and catch a ball to someone else more than 10 times without dropping it? Try bouncing a ball against a wall and catching it. How many times can you throw a ball into a bucket/the washing basket without missing?</p>
 <p>Play a game that involves numbers eg. dominoes, cards, snakes and ladders etc. Notice whether you are matching numbers, counting forwards or backwards, adding or taking away?</p>	<p>Read numbers when you are out and about. What is the largest number you can spot? Are the numerals always in the correct order? Do they get bigger or smaller?</p> 	<p>Make a drawing of your favourite toy.</p>  <p>Now draw or find an image of your Mummy or Daddy's favourite toy. Are they similar? Ask Mummy or Daddy why they enjoyed playing with it. Ask your grandparents about their favourites too.</p>
<p>Practise your cutting skills <b>with an adult</b>. Can you cut around some pictures from an old magazine or newspaper? Make a collage of your favourite toys from a catalogue.</p>  <p>Remember to keep your cutting elbow tucked in and your thumb facing the sky as you cut!</p>	<p>Choose a secret location. Make a list of 5 things you can see, 5 things you can hear, 5 things you can smell and 5 things you can touch. Get someone else to guess where you were! Ask us too, we'd love to solve your clues.</p> 	<p>Read 3 stories with an adult.</p>  <p>Where is the story set? Talk about the characters in each story, how are they feeling? What was your favourite part of the story? Would you change anything about it if you could?</p>
